Journal - July/August 2025 Issue

Last month we celebrated D-Day's 80th Anniversary. It was particularly poignant for me as my father, Jack, was the Naval Officer Commanding the invasion of Sword Beach, Roger Sector (that which is furthest east and closest to Ouistreham). He, aged 31, and his Commando, consisting of 10 officers and 60 other ranks, landed in the 2nd wave 20 minutes after H-Hour on D-Day, 6th June 1944, the first wave having delivered demolition expert commandos tasked with destroying the anti-ship mined obstructions, part of the Atlantic Wall defences of the German military. The Royal Navy Commandos were responsible for the organisation of the beach-head, erecting signage, directing troops and vehicles and clearing wreckage that would have slowed our invasion efforts. They were under fire constantly until Sword Beach was closed weeks later as it had become redundant once the Mulberry Harbour at Arromanches had become fully operational.

Previously, my father was stationed at Dorlin House on Loch Moidart, on the west coast of Scotland training troops from all allied countries in amphibious landings and warfare. He, and his RN Commando, also played their part in the invasion of Sicily.

My father very rarely talked about this experiences and then only the amusing incidents. He told me much later that he suffered terrible nightmares most nights. He died in 2012 aged 99 and is very much missed.

This is my last editorial, and I will try my very best not to "blow" it at this late stage. My profound thanks to the small team who have supported the Journal and me throughout. And a huge thank you to all those lovely distributors who have delivered your journals every month and have also collected subscriptions to keep us viable. And a particular thank you to all those who have contributed articles, both regular and "one off", and letters. Editing the journal for four years has been an education. I have learned a great deal about our lovely villages and you residents, and I have even learned a little bit about me! I have tried hard not to offend and I can't think of anybody who has offended me. We part on good terms I believe!

I am so pleased you will be in such very good hands with the new editorial team. They have abundant talent, experience and, above all else, youth! Melanie, Inge and Lucy are not short of ideas too. And they understand how important the Journal is, in all its forms. I wish them every success and I am overjoyed to be passing the baton to them.

News from All Saints Church, Wrington

Dear friends,

As I write, we're having one of those summers which you just dream about! The sun is beautifully warm. There's a beautiful breeze ensuring it doesn't get too hot. And gardens everywhere are looking their best. It's a beautiful time of year. But it's worth looking upwards as well as outwards to recognise God as creator.

Perhaps one of the strongest arguments for the existence of God is his gift of creation. While scientists today tell us how creation started with the "Big Bang" (a thesis I wouldn't begin to deny), I simply can't think that the complexity of creation was simply the result of the expansion of the universe and the collision of random gases. Look around at the beauty of creation. Could that really have been caused randomly. I can't believe so. Rather, I believe there must have been some intelligent design behind creation – a supreme power who set up creation in all its glory, the One who many of us call God.

A compelling example of intelligent design in nature is the human eye. Its intricate structure, with components like the cornea, lens, retina, and optic nerve, all working together to enable sight, is often cited as evidence of intelligent design. The complexity and interconnectedness of these parts suggest a level of organization that proponents of intelligent design argue cannot be explained by random chance.

For me, though, I don't need to be convinced by anything as complex. As I walk back up the hill to the Rectory and look down Wrington Vale, I'm more convinced than ever by the concept of God as Creator.

This is something we're particularly celebrating this month in Wrington with the Garden Trail on Saturday 12th July. 14 gardens will be open around the village from 10.30 a.m. – 4.30 p.m. (more details further on in the Journal). Do come and have a look – and enjoy God's creation!

On our farms - July/August 2025

Continuing Professional Development (CPD) can mean different things to different people and to some it doesn't mean a thing. If you are an accountant you need to spend a certain amount of time each year keeping up to date with latest practice. If you're involved with Health and Safety you have to go on courses on a regular basis. If you're a farmer, the world is your oyster. As well as the more formal keeping up with things, in farming CPD can include visiting other farms to see how they do things. I have recently completed some CPD training on farms in Herefordshire. A group of us went on a tour. First stop was a 600 cow dairy farm with all the cows milked by robots. As well as robots milking the cows, robots are used to keep the feed close enough to the cows for them to eat it and more robots used to clear the poo away from where the cows stand and into a slurry pit. From there, the slurry is pumped into an anaerobic digester where it is broken down and the methane used to power a combined heat and power engine to produce electricity. This is used to power all the robots. From there we visited two fruit and vegetable growers. We saw more strawberries in one hour than I think I will see in my whole life as well as a host of other soft fruits. We also saw poly tunnels which housed 80% of the undercover asparagus grown in the UK. Both farms were technically almost perfect. One had the edge on the other the way they recruit and manage their staff. They recruit hundreds of foreign pickers each summer to pick their fruit when it is in perfect condition. In previous years they were able to draw on the likes of Polish and Slovakian pickers with a relatively European outlook. With the economic climate in these countries improving, they have had to go to the 'stan' countries for staff. Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan to name but a few. These Central Asian countries have quite a different culture than the UK and to make sure they get the best chance of recruiting and retaining staff they have spent a lot of time in these 'stan' countries trying to understand what would make their stay in the UK good enough for them to want to stay for a whole picking season. They recruit hundreds of pickers each year and by comparison we only recruit a few. But, the principle is the same. What can we do to make an employees' role as fulfilling and conditions acceptable as possible? After the cows, fruit and vegetables we visited a cider mill. Again, plenty of messages to take away about specific things. Through the course of a day and a half, we were exposed to four world class businesses. Each would stand their ground up against any competitor. CPD in this form is never a chore but always a pleasure and farmers are more than happy to share their experience.

Butcombe History Walk July 28 2025 10am by the postbox

Carole Venner will lead a walk round some of the interesting sites in lower Butcombe. This year St.Michael's and All Angels will be 600 years old so we will be told some of the fascinating things that can be seen inside and out of the building. We will see where the children went to school and where they had to walk to get a drink of water. We will then walk up the hill and across a field to be shown in the distance the site of Fairy Toot a scheduled Ancient Monument. Other things we will see is where Dad's Army had a reading room, where a robbery took place, where a chapel was built but now is used as a house, where the water mill mentioned in the Domesday Book was, where Derek Bourgeoise lived and where there was a postoffice where the post mistress was able to rock the baby upstairs in its cradle while she served customers downstairs! Everyone is welcome but no dogs please and everyone takes responsibility for their own safety.

Butcombe History Walk August 18 2025 10am by the postbox

Carole Venner will lead a second history walk round upper Butcombe. We will walk quite close to Butcombe Farm where Judge Jefferies held a court and is why there is an area called Hanging Wood. We will see where Butcombe Bitter was created, we will pass where the first Channel 4 film was filmed and close by where 2 murders and a suicide took place in 1928. The walk takes us near to Butcombe Court which it is believed to stand on the site of a farmhouse given to the Cistercian Abbey of Thame, Oxfordshire. It is said Queen Anne and George IV visited Butcombe Court. We will hear about the gold sarcophagus said to be buried in a secret passage between Butcombe Court and Regilbury Court and the very first Australian novel Quintus Servinton written by the convict Henry Savery born at Butcombe Court in 1791. We make our way to the site of the corn mill mentioned in the Domesday book. We then return home passed Cleaves Well. It is here that in 1921 farmers queued up to 24 hours per day to dip out water into water carts. Water reached the village in 1932.

Everyone is welcome on the walk but no dogs please and everyone takes responsibility for their own safety.

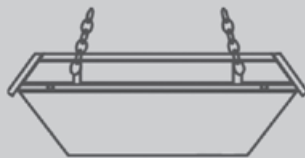

We know many of our residents are keen to support our local environment and wildlife.

Our parish is under many pressures, and we would like your help to monitor the current position, recording what you see and hear so that we have a clear picture of wildlife in our local area and what actions might be taken to improve it.

We are looking to encourage you, if you are not already registered, to register with Bristol Regional Environmental Records Centre and record all wildlife sightings on a regular basis. You can do this at <https://recording.brerc.org.uk/>

You may find the app <https://merlin.allaboutbirds.org/> helpful and interesting in identifying birds.

Also, North Somerset Council are currently promoting a special survey to monitor the bat population of North Somerset. Again, something very important for us as we are very close to special sites for bats. Letter to the Editor / Wrington Garden Trail

I read Veronica's memories of VE day with great interest. We are great friends and there is only 1 day's difference in age between us. However, our memories of VE day were very different. I was living in Ealing in 1945. My father was Musical Director of Ealing Film Studios and he only had to cross the road to go to work!

I moved to Wrington in the early 1970's to work at the Further Education Staff College which was then at Coombe Lodge, Blagdon.

For 12 years I lived in the flat at Webbsbrook House when it was owned by Commander and Mrs Leggett.

When my mother died in 1985 I sold the home in Hampstead and bought where I live now. Far from putting incomers down the residents embraced my ideas.

First, I started the Garden Trail with Mr David Parkes, then I wrote the first of 6 pantomimes, 'Dick Whittington Sub Mendip'. The cast included Michael Clark (the dame), Chris Clark, Dr Norman Tricks, Andrew Densham and the then Rector, Derek Hooper who was King Rat. The club is still going strong 40 odd years on.

Then I wrote a Historical Pageant to finish off the fairs week which had been revived. I also became the first female Chair of the Parish Council.

On VE day, Father, Mother and I took the underground to Trafalgar Square. We walked up the Mall to Buckingham Palace, along with many others. We saw the King and Queen, the Princesses and Winston Churchill several times on the Balcony. The Princesses also came right down to the Palace gates! Someone had managed to get a few streetlights on which amazed me.

One memory Veronica and I share – open windows, curtains pulled back and the lights on!

We were battered and broke but not broken. We had not been invaded and, with the help of the Americans, we had won!

Recipe for June 2025

ORANGE AND ALMOND CAKE

EQUIPMENT

This will need a 23 cm loose based tin, greased and floured.



INGREDIENTS CAKE

200g caster sugar
200ml light Olive oil
4 large eggs
150g SR flour plus 1 tsp baking powder
100g ground almonds
Zest of 2 oranges

INGREDIENTS TOPPING:

75ml orange juice
50g caster sugar
100g flaked almonds optional

METHOD:

Oven temp 140 C fan

Whisk the eggs, sugar and oil in a bowl for 5 minutes till the mixture is light and fluffy.

Sift flour, ground almonds and baking powder, add a pinch salt then gently fold into egg mix along with orange zest and put into prepared cake tin and bake for 1 hour, cover if browning too much.

If using flaked almonds, scatter over top about 10 minutes before cake is ready.

While cake is baking heat the orange juice and sugar in a pan ready to drizzle over baked cake. Release cake from tin when cool.

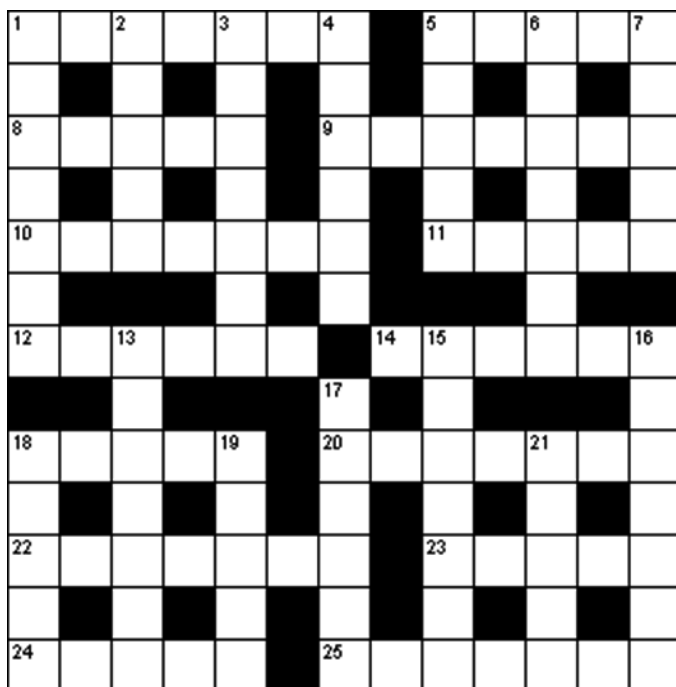

Wrington Doctors - Henry William Collins

Henry William Collins was born on 21 March 1847 in Geelong, Victoria, Australia, where his father Ebenezer was vicar Of Christ Church in the town. He was educated at Godolphin Grammar School in Hammersmith.

The *Bath Chronicle* of 31 March 1870 reported that Collins, of Wrington, and Guy's Hospital, had passed his examination at Apothecaries' Hall in the science and practice of medicine, thus becoming a Licentiate and entitling him to put the letters L.S.A after his name. The following year he became a member of the Royal College of Surgeons. The 1871 Census showed that he was a medical student lodging in Southwark with a Mr. and Mrs. Hurd.

On leaving Guy's, he joined Dr. D'eath (what an unfortunate name for a doctor!) in Buckingham and in 1872 he came back to Wrington, taking up the practice relinquished by George Barnes, and eventually becoming a partner to Peter Chadwick. He is listed as such in the 1875 edition of Kelly's Directory. He also became assistant surgeon to the 4th Battalion Prince Albert Light Infantry and Medical Officer to the Wrington male and female Friendly Societies and the West Mendip Society.

On 20 August 1876, at All Saints' Church in Wrington, he married 32-year-old Harriet Broadley Hesse, the youngest of four daughters of Frederick Legrew Hesse, rector of nearby Rowberrow.

William and Harriet stayed in the village until 1902, by which time they were living at *Blanche House* (now *Webbsbrook House*) in Silver Street, confirmed by a small ad placed by Harriet in the *Weston Gazette* of 12 January 1900: "*House and parlourmaid wanted for small family. Churchwoman – Mrs. Collins, Blanche House, Wrington, Somerset.*"

William died on 9 January 1906 in Hove, although he is buried in All Saints' churchyard in Wrington alongside Harriet, who lived another thirty-two years, dying at the great age of ninety-four. The February issue of the *Wrington Parish Magazine* carried a tribute to his life and work:

"With mingled feelings of regret and thankfulness, on Sat 13th Jan. 1906 we laid to rest the mortal remains of Henry William Collins, whose long and painful illness we had all followed with ever-increasing sympathy. Of his great kindness and courtesy it is needless to write, for each and all will be able to treasure up the remembrance of these distinguished traits of his character. He was a devout Churchman and held the office of Rector's Sidesman, until he left the parish in October 1902, at which date he also retired from practice. All hoped he would have many happy quiet years to spend in our neighbourhood, but it was not to be. Soon his health began to fail under the attacks of that fell disease which at last overcame him. He passed away on Tuesday 9th. January 1906.

RETURN OF RNLI LIFEGUARDS TO BEACHES IN THE SOUTH WEST

A reminder that the RNLI Lifeguard Team will return to patrol the beaches at Burnham-on-Sea and Breaux this summer from Saturday 5 July to Saturday 7 September inclusive; beach patrol times will be from 10:00am to 6:00pm. However, this will be but one team patrolling 100 beaches across the whole of the South West Peninsula covering the most popular beaches in Devon, Cornwall, Dorset & Hampshire. The Weston-super-Mare D Class lifeboat was launched on Friday 16th May 2025 at 10:45 pm after being paged at 10:36 pm to support local emergency services. Crew members including a GP and Junior Doctor were able to provide casualty care until an ambulance arrived and took over.

The lifeboat returned to the station at 11:35 pm, where it was washed down and returned to service.

Just a few minutes after 7PM on the evening of Saturday 15th May, Burnham Lifeboat crews were urgently tasked to reports of a vessel that had capsized whilst towing a water skier in the area of Combswich.

With the nature of this emergency and unknown severity, Lifeboat Operations Manager and Duty LA Matt Davies authorised both Atlantic 85 and D-Class Lifeboats for immediate launch.

Within 10 minutes of the pagers sounding, the D-Class and crew were on the water making best speed to the reported area of the casualty, in what was otherwise a warm, calm sunny evening in Burnham. As the Atlantic 85 and crew were within seconds of touching the water to launch, good news came over the radio that the casualty vessel had been self recovered and all persons were accounted for. The D Class Helmsman Nick added "We were glad for a good outcome here."

BELLA SILVER

A new Artisan Quarter has opened in Wrington with silversmith, enamellist and potter taking up residence in studios amongst beautiful plants, coffee shop and landscaping at Middlecombe Nursery.



The Journal meets Michelle Gibbs of *Bella Silver – Reclaimed, Reformed and Reloved* – unique jewellery which breathes new creative life into antique solid silver.

SMOOTH sea glass set in a silver ring made of Victorian sugar tongs, a grandmother's wedding ring remodelled for her granddaughter's marriage, a christening bracelet turned into beautiful earrings.

These are just a few of the once solid silver treasures that silversmith, Michelle Gibbs, transforms into desirable new heirlooms.

Michelle, aged 40, of High Street, Wrington, said: "I always buy antique solid silver because it's such quality precious metal.

"I have a tin of antique cutlery and old precious gifts that I recreate into something new because I love the feel and history they still hold.

"I try and keep original silversmith marks

and might incorporate other pieces for texture like brass from an old drinking mug in The Plough that becomes a sliver of additional colour."

Silver was formed billions of years ago. Scientist believe it was fashioned out of the cataclysmic supernova explosions of collapsing stars which dispersed silver into space and to earth.

Here, hot mineral waters carried and deposited silver underground and has been mined by humans for more than 5000 years, as precious, light-reflecting jewellery, religious objects and coins.

It also has practical uses for dental fillings, photography, water disinfection, and electronic equipment.

It's estimated there is just 20 years of undiscovered, mineable silver left world-wide, so recycling is vital.

Michelle transforms antique silver by carefully dismantling original pieces, liquifying metal, removing impurities, then casting, reshaping, refining and polishing into a new design.

The work can be dirty and noisy, with soldering, sawing, grinding and chemical pickling baths but the finished product is worth all the effort.

Michelle said: "I've had lovely commissions, especially the sea glass found by children for their mum who brought in an old ring of their grandmother and I created something which connects three generations."

The mum-of-three, moved to Wington with Dyf, a pilot, she met in Austria on his birthday, when she was a childrens' holiday rep.

The pair travelled to Africa, India and the Canary Islands, then mar-

ried in Australia before returning to Wales where Dyf's family lived before moving to Wington.

"I love the village," she said: "and once we settled here, I trained to be silversmith which is what I've always wanted to do and now I have this brilliant studio."

Silver Folklore:

*Silver has been used for sacred communion chalices and has ceremonial connections. Thirty pieces of silver were enough to pay for Judas Iscariot's betrayal.

*Artemis – the Greek Goddess of the hunt and moon is depicted laden with silver. It's been used in amulets and talismans to ward off evil spirits and linked to the silvery moon for protective powers.

*Silver has been long deemed as a metal symbol of purity and harmony. Legend has it that silver bullets could kill vampires.

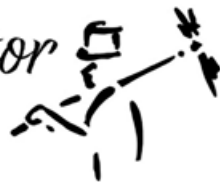

Wrington's Telephone Box Library

Anyone who's ever popped into Mother Hen on Wrington's Broad Street for a cup of coffee can't fail to have noticed the red BT phone box just outside, now a small but perfectly formed mini library crammed full of everything from picture books to blockbuster novels, biographies to thrillers.

But how did the village come to have one of these? And how does it all work? In the interests of journalism I popped in one Monday evening to try it all out.

The very first telephone box-cum-library was set up not far from Wrington, in the village of Westbury-sub-Mendip. Here the local parish council took advantage of BT's 2008 "adopt a kiosk" programme to buy one for just £1 and when funding for the village's mobile library was subsequently cut, the idea of a mini phone box library was born.

Thousands more towns and villages followed suit, with Wrington gaining its phone box library in 2016.

A dedicated team of just two volunteers, Helen Ward and Pam Milman keep the library tidy and periodically do a charity shop run with some of the older books to help keep things fresh. Wringtonians can bring their own unwanted books to the library with fiction, children's books and broad interest non-fiction books preferred.

When I visited there was a sizeable collection of thrillers by crime writers Dan Brown, Patricia Cornwell and Lee Child, plus a couple of unusual factual books including "All you need to know about the music business" and "Buying antique pottery and porcelain". The bottom shelf held a host of children's books including a well-thumbed copy of David Walliams "Gangsta Granny" and a hardback copy of "The Hungry Caterpillar".

There were no first editions in our library (I looked!) But I did find plenty of romance (Danielle Steel, Joanna Trollope), biographies of both Madonna and Michael Schumacher, a copy of the Good News Bible and - for balance - a paperback edition of The Exorcist. Intriguingly there were also a couple of books that had started their lives in local, and not so local, libraries.

I chose three books to take home with me.

The first - "In Gratitude" by Jenny Diski - is a memoir on the late writer's life and her relationship with fellow writer Doris Lessing, who unofficially adopted her. I learnt a lot about the 60s. But also about the power of one person to change the life of another.

My second choice was The Oxford Book of Ballads. I've always loved folk music and this book contains the origins of many ballads that have subsequently been woven into modern day folk song - including my favourite "Lady Maisry."

For my final choice I was torn between Ben Fogle's "Labrador - the story of the world's favourite dog" and the "Nigella Express" cookbook - but hastily chose the latter because on this particular Monday evening I was more in need of a quick recipe than a long read. This book has some really speedy eats - perfect for someone who's spent too long in a phone box library browsing books instead of getting the dinner on. I settled on Nigella's Curry in a Hurry - and it was on the table with the minimum of fuss within 30 minutes.

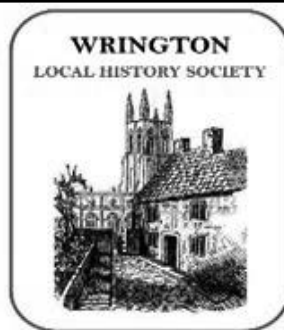

Hannah More Film Evening at Barley Wood

2025 marks two anniversaries related to Wtrington's "most famous" resident, Hannah More.

Hannah was born in Fishponds, Bristol in February in 1745 and, after some time in London, returned to the West Country, having a cottage built at Cowslip Green, where she moved 240 years ago in 1785. Finding the property a little small for her and her many influential visitors she bought a piece of land to the north-east of the village and built Barley Wood where she resided from 1802 to 1828.



A few years back a Bristol-based media company produced a low-budget feature film about the life and work of Hannah. We have acquired a copy and are pleased to be showing the film at our July 15th meeting and are further excited that we have arranged with the owners of Barley Wood to present this in the house, so associated with the lady.

The film presentation will commence at 7pm with an introduction from Dr Joanne Edwards, a trustee of the Hannah More Trust who, many may remember, gave WLHS a highly entertaining and informative talk of Hannah's work a few years back. Prior to that Barley Wood are kindly allowing us to have a look around the house and grounds from 6pm. The history society will have a display of photos of Barley Wood and other items of interest and we are also pleased to have the support of the Wrington Drama Club.
